2. Turn in the complete form to the Curator or volunteer on duty at the Hotel Florence or fax to 773-660-2341. **PAYMENT BY U.S. CHECK OR CASH IS DUE AT THE TIME THE ORDER IS PLACED.** Credit card payment is not accepted. All checks should be made out to the Pullman State Historic Site.
